All the students of every faculty in the College participated in the survey enthusiastically. The response of the students was more than 98% of all the students. Nine hundred and twenty-eight students registered their feedback. Percentage-participation of the students from different faculties studying in different years is given in the following table.







The overall percentage of feedback of the students about different parameters is shown in the following graphs:






2. Parameter II: Regularity




3. Parameter III: Syllabus Completion





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
Summary Students' Feedback Report (2017-18)


In the academic year 2017-18, the College introduced revised students' feedback surveys to incorporate the new Students' Satisfaction Survey format laid down by the revised NAAC assessment guidelines. It was decided to implement the survey administration system through the email correspondence of the Departments to their students. Two Google forms were prepared. The first form was developed for collecting responses of the students as per the Key Indicator of criterion 2.7.1; and, second for recording the teaching-learning experience of the students in the College. It was decided that the feedback would be collected in two phases; once before the term end and again at the time of admissions in the next academic year in the month of June 2018. The following sections brief the analysis of the responses collected in the first phase of this on-line survey. The questionnaires of both the feedback forms are annexed at the end of this survey report.

1. Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS-Key Indicator Criterion 2.7.1)

In the first phase, this form was emailed to more than 1250 students of the College; and, six hundred and twenty two of them responded by completely filling the form. Their responses to different questions are graphically presented below:








Count of 2. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


Count of 3. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?






Count of 4. How well were the teachers able to communicate?


Count of 5. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as






Count of 6. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.






Count of 10. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.






Count of 12. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.








Count of 14. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.








2. Student Satisfaction Survey (Teaching-Learning Experience) Summary of responses of the students in Commerce Department





Count of How do you rate teaching qualities of Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni? [Punctuality]





The students of every faculty in the College participated in the survey. The response of the students was more than 34% of all the students. Four hundred and forty four students registered their feedback.







This form was to all the 1288 students of the college. Five Hundred and thirty one among them completely responded to the survey. Their responses to different questions are graphically given below.






Count of 4. How well were the teachers able to communicate?


