I, Dr. Anand G. Jumle, Principal of SNDT Arts and Commerce College for Women, Pune, present this Compliance Report to the internal AAA Committee Experts. It is a combined report of compliance for three years, namely, 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2018-19 for which the process of the Academic and Administrative Audit was completed in the year 2019-20. This report narrates the compliance made in the chronological order of the suggestion given.

1. Funds should be raised through Alumni

Even though the Alumni Association of the College is duly registered, the Association has not yet opened the bank account. Due to this reason, the funds in monetary nature are not collected from the alumni. However, the College has focused on increasing the active participation of alumni in the functioning of the College. It is decided that every Department in the College will formally invite its one or two renowned alumni members in the department as Guest or Visiting Faculty for exposing the present students about the skills needed in pursuing their chosen career.  training programmes of longer duration ranging from a week to four months. Few short
