

The SNDT Arts and Commerce College for Women was founded by Bharatratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve on 5th July 1916, with five students. It is this college at Pune, with which he started the functioning of the Indian Women's University.

This college is thus the very first institution of the university. Today, it functions as a conducted college, owned and governed by the SNDT Women's University, Mumbai. Both the college as well as the university came to be named after Shreemati Nathibai Damodar Thackersey, mother of Sir Vitthaldas Thackersey, who generously donated in the year 1920 for girl's education.

The IQAC of the College in continuing with the legacy of focusing on the overall development of the students has conducted the activities with a blend of traditional and new skills, to be imparted to students which they require to compete in the changing scenario. The College aims at making education student-centric.

Dr. Durga Murari spoke on Plagiarism and she did talk about what is plagiarism, why do people plagiarize, how to do they do it. She mentioned that plagiarism is stealing and publication of author's language, thoughts and ideas and representing them as one's own original work. She very aptly said Plagiarism is an academic dishonesty and breach of journalistic ethics. She also informed how to give citation if we copy or take information from any book or journal or any source for that matter.

The second speaker, Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade spoke on Intellectual Property (IP). She said IP is a catergory of property that includes intangible creations of the human intellect, and primarily encompasses copyrights, and patents. Student-Led Conference

Research Cells of SNDT Arts and Commerce College for Women, Pune & Balaji College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Pune had jointly organised **Two Day Student-Led Conference on Environment Sustainability: Students' Perspective** on 29th and 30th January, 2019. The main objectives were to create environment awareness among young generation and to develop research skills among students.





In all 25 groups of students along with their teacher guides have participated with their research papers on environmental issues. Not only the number but varied interesting subjects of research speak about the success of the Conference.

On 29th January the conference was inaugurated in the hands of Dr. Deepali Nimbalkar, Senior Scientist and Head, Vasantdada Sugar Institute, Pune. Principal of Balaji College Dr. G. Y. Shitole and Campus Director Dr. G. K. Shirude graced the functions and encouraged participants. Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni, Vice Principal, SNDT Arts and Commerce College delived contextual speech about the need for collaborative student-research activity. Teaching staff and students participants of both the colleges were present. On this occasion all the 25 groups displayed and presented their topic with the help of posters.

On 30th January in the first session selected 10 papers, based on scores of peer review by students and poster presentation, were presented by using PPTs. The team of judges comprising of teachers and students representatives of both the colleges assessed the presentations based on pre-determined factors for assessment.

Smt. Shailaja Deshpande, Founder Director of NGO namely Jeevitnadi addressed the gathering with her wide experiences and expertise. Her focus was on Eco System, importance of Rivers and factors of sustainable development.

A paper titled Development of Renewable Energy: A key Driver of Indian Energy Security by Pooja Kadam and Yogeshwari Mahajan under the guidance of Dr. Rohini

Bhoite secured Best Paper Award amongst SNDT group. A paper titled Solid Waste Management –System in Pimpri- Chinchwad: Problems and Prospects by Jim Johny Cheeram, Sakshi Agarwal and Manisha Prajapati under the guidance of Dr. Jayashree Nambiar secured Best Paper Award amongst the papers from Balaji College.





Workshop on Google Classroom

Dates: 18 June 2018 to 30 June 2018

At the pro-active initiative of Principal, Dr. Anand G. Jumle the preparations of this "ICT in Education" endeavour in the College started in the month of April 2018. Every teacher was served a written notice to prepare MCQs of every of his/ her courses taught in the


softcopy; and, also to collect and keep ready reference material as well as the long and brief answer questions in the softcopy form in the summer vacation 2018. It was clearly intimated that the workshop on Google classroom to accommodate and administer the teaching material mentioned above would be conducted in the first week of the academic year 2018-19. Accordingly, the workshop was conducted between 18 and 20 June 2018 by Vice Principal, Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni. After the workshop, the participant-teachers were given 10 days for creating only one Google Classroom in the drive of the email address of the Department concerned, for any one of the courses taught to accommodate the teaching material prepared and kept ready by them in the vacation. During these 10 days, despite of non-availability of computers and internet facility; and, very hectic schedule of admissions majority of the participant-teachers tried their best to practically compete the assigned task.

The schedule of presentations for demonstration of the Google classrooms created by the participant-teachers was informed through an email by IQAC on 25 June 2018. Except for a couple of teachers, the participation of teachers in the presentations was very positive, affirmative and encouraging. Almost all the teachers had invited their students to the Google classrooms. The response of their students in joining the classes was also found satisfactory. Dr. Madhura Joshi, IQAC Co-ordinator and Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni, Workshop Facilitator were the Peer Assessors for the presentations, along with Principal, Dr. Anand G. Jumle.

The Google classrooms are used in the College with following Objectives:

- 1. To use of Google Classrooms as a supplementary aid to classroom teaching-learning
- 2. To use the classroom effectively to cater different needs of above average and below average students
- 3. To enable the teachers to use technology-based teaching methods which otherwise cannot be used in the classrooms
- 4. To give exposure to students of latest software and packages
- 5. To bring the flexibility and transparency in continuous assessment system
- 6. To use varied evaluation and assessment methods
- 7. To eliminate the subjectivity in assessment
- 8. To make learning interesting and effective.


Value added course on Gender Sensitization For students of B. Com. 1 Certificate Course in Law relating to Rights of Women

A 15 Session-Certificate Course in "Law relating to Rights of Women" was Conducted from 8th February to 18th February 2019 for B. Com. I students. Adv. Dr. Pratapsinh Salunke was the resource person for the course. 144 students of B. Com. I registered their names for the course. However 119 students successfully completed the course by attending the sessions and by appearing for the examination at the end of the course. Mr. Raindas Hande worked as the teacher coordinator for the course.

Study material of the course in English and Marathi is provided to the students to facilitate them to understand the concepts and laws. The printed question paper was administered for the assessment of the students. 
