IQAC, SNDT Arts and Commerce College for Women, Pune, presents this Compliance Report to the AAA Committees. This report narrates the compliance made in the year 2020-21 in the order of suggestions made by the internal committee for the academic year 2019-20.

Remarks of Internal Committee and its compliance-

1. Criterion wise presentations were appreciated by the Committee:

This year the College was required to shift to complete Online Administration and Teaching-Learning mode due to COVID-19 Pandemic. The present report tries to narrate the experts about these changes.

2. Well defined strategies were appreciated by the AAA Committee members:

As far as the strategies for quality improvements are concerned, in the report, the Committee had appreciated the efforts of the College. During 2020-21, considering the NAAC the focus was on implementation of those strategies.

3. Lacunas (mismatch) in the student-teacher ratio due to mixing up aided course with self-supporting courses. This should be segregated and arranged separately:

The suggestion was taken care off and accordingly in the year 2020-21, the student-teacher ratio is calculated considering recommendations of NAAC as well.

4. In the result analysis, it is necessary to explain low result in certain courses. The root cause should be find out to overcome this situation:

The Committee discussed about the low result. The Principal discussed the issue with the staff members and the students for finding out the root cause; and, for taking immediate steps. The College arranged lecture series for additional inputs to the students, provided study material, re-

distributed the workload; as a result, students' performance improved.

5. Other than UGC, other agencies like ICSSR, DST, CSIR, ISRO should be considered for

receiving grants for projects, seminars. Workshops:

During the period of COVID 19 Pandemic the College received two projects.

The first project is from Department of Police titled 'Study of Suicide Cases Registered in Pune during COVID 19 Lockdown in the year 2020'. Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni, Principal (Addl. Charge) was the Project Coordinator and Dr. Manasee Rajhans and Mrs. Vasanti Joshi were the Project

Associates. The report was submitted and published in August 2020.

The second project titled 'A Study of Impact of COVID-19 CSR Funding on Ongoing CSR Projects of Companies in India with Special Reference to CSR projects of Companies in Pune' is funded by the ICSSR (Indian Institute of Social Sciences as apart special call for the studies focusing on Social Sciences. The total grant of Rs 3,40,000 for the project for nine months is granted vide letter dated 1st March 2021. Dr. Madhavi Kulkarni is the Project Director and Mrs.
